After our exciting June 11-14 Annual Meeting we have a great deal of news to share. Patrick Madden, UNA-USA's new Executive Director, capably led the proceedings. Speakers included Tim Wirth, President of the UN Foundation, who introduced Ambassador Rice. Rice's remarks focused on the great importance the United Nations has for the U.S. and U.S. foreign policy.

UN Foundation COO Kathy Bushkin Calvin welcomed participants and also introduced Nafis Sadik, former head of the UN Population Fund and a member of the Foundation Board. Full funding for the UN Population Fund, as supported by the President but denied by the House of Representatives, is needed to help provide reproductive health services to women, in accord with Millennium Development Goals for the health of mothers and children as well as gender issues.
