Its program consists of ten seminar modules geared to develop and enhance the scope of the work and activities of young business executives at U.S. based multi-national corporations and young professionals within the NGO, United Nations, media, law, government, diplomatic and academic communities.

The Worldview seminars are corporate executive training programs of the United Nations Association of New York. We are seeking the best and brightest young professionals between the ages of 25 and 40. Accordingly, applicants are required to have a bachelor's degree and a minimum three years professional experience or relevant graduate work.

Seminar topics are designed to stimulate informal but academic discussions with practitioners in the international arena and to illuminate and explore business, political, economic and social trends in different regions of the world. Where appropriate, they also address the role of the UN within these contexts.

Our Worldview discussions are led by distinguished lecturers including UN ambassadors, noted academics and leaders in global business.
