The purpose of this consultation is to engage participants in a discussion on what should be done in order to ensure successful adoption and implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals that have emerged from numerous discussions in the past several years. The SDGs will follow on the eight Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) on which the UN, governments, non-governmental organizations and others have worked since 2000, and which will end in 2014.

Coming out of the Rio+20 Conference in 2012, a 30-member Open Working Group of the General Assembly developed and submitted a proposal for a set of Sustainable Development Goals that would take effect from 2015 - 2030. Seventeen goals have emerged. Our Division board has selected several for our attention on the 31st. Roundtables will focus on these goals:

Goal 3. Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all at all ages

Goal 4. Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote life-long learning opportunities for all

Goal 5. Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls

Goal 7. Ensure access to affordable, reliable, sustainable, and modern energy for all

Goal 13. Take urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts*

*Acknowledging that the UNFCCC is the primary international, intergovernmental forum for negotiating the global response to climate change.

Goal 16. Promote peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, provide access to justice for all and build effective, accountable and inclusive institutions at all levels

Throughout these discussions we will consider "The Impact of Social Media Networks on Development", a topic added by a member of the Division board.

In keeping with the 2014 UN Day Theme "Global Citizenship and Youth," we want to engage adults, young professionals and youth in the discussions.

This event and others held by UNA Chapters and Divisions around the U.S. will report to UNA-USA with recommendations for continuing to build support for the SDGs, and will feed into a final UNA-USA ACTION Plan for supporting the implementation of the SDGs in 2015.

To bring real and lasting peace to end a violent conflict, the UN often must disarm, demobilize, and reintegrate (DDR) troops and militias, institute strategic sector reform (SSR), meaning build capacity, efficiency, and unity among military and law enforcement personnel, and encourage justice sector reform (JSR) so that laws and law enforcement institutions are transparent, equitable and in accordance with international human rights norms. We are bringing together a spectacular expert panel to discuss these critical components of successful UN peacekeeping operations: Christopher O'Donnell, a program officer with the UN Department of Peacekeeping, DDR section, with ten years of very recent field experience in DDR operations; Professor Mark Ungar from Brooklyn College, who has published extensively on post-conflict, multilateral efforts with a focus on Central America. Professor Ungar has also advised the UN in its post-conflict programs that incorporate DDR and SSR strategies. We are especially honored to have Joseph Stephanides, a 28 year veteran of the UN and an adjunct professor at the Brooklyn Campus of Long Island University's UN Graduate Program. Mr. Stephanides Head of the Office of the UN Secretary-General in Iran (UNOSGI) and Head of the Kamanjab and Sesfontein Political Office of the United Nations Transition Assistance Group (UNTAG).

She also worked as assistant to former Secretary-General Kofi Annan from 2005 to 2007.

Maty joined the United Nations in the year 2000 as a public information assistant and has introduced the Organization to over 10,000 people. Prior to working for the UN, she worked in the private sector as assistant manager in the car fleet department for NCR in England.

Maty is a French national and holds an MBA in International Business and a Master's degree in Economics and Law from Nanterre University in Paris, France.

Malea Otranto UNICEF USA – End Trafficking Fellow



UNA Hudson Valley will have Malea Otranto, a representative from UNICEF USA's End Trafficking program come to SUNY New Paltz to offer an address on human trafficking and what the UN and UNICEF are doing to combat this issue.

Malea was recently accepted into the UNICEF USA fellowship program, and selected to be the End Trafficking Program fellow based on her background and experience within the anti-human trafficking field. Malea seeks to raise awareness and educate communities about child trafficking in the United States.

Malea has worked at Polaris, one of the leading organizations within the anti-human trafficking field. She has facilitated public speaking workshops with survivors, led Human Trafficking 101 trainings, and conducted extensive research on illicit Asian massage parlors and Asian sex trafficking networks across the United States.

Malea spent the 2012-13 studying abroad in Europe and South Africa, where she focused on human rights and international human trafficking. In the fall, Malea completed a Humanitarian Law Program and was selected to go to Kosovo, where she met with governmental organizations to discuss solutions for Kosovo's current human trafficking epidemic. Malea graduated with a degree in Law and Society from American University.

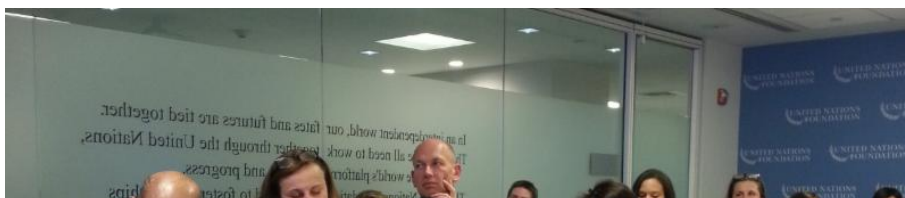

Members of the Westchester Chapter and other chapters also participated.



Lauren von Eckartsberg, Latin American and Caribbean Affairs Committee of UNA-SNY posted this [blog entry](#):

"To change everything, we need everyone." This was the slogan for The People's Climate March that took place on September 21st in New York City just before heads of state met at the UN summit on Climate Action. A group of UNA/YP members were a part of the collective everyone that amassed to over 400,000 participants. As the largest climate march in history, members trod down Central Park West, past the steel globe at Columbus Circle, through Times Square, ending at 11th street. Participants donned costumes, held signs calling awareness to various problems and solutions concerning the climate crisis, marched with their family members, and collectively came out to show support for the cause. The atmosphere of the march was one of mutual support and openness to new ideas and ways to solve the problem of climate change. It was a great opportunity for UNA/YP members to show support for climate action and to be a part of the historical event calling heads of state to act."
