Southern NYS Division to participate in Universal Periodic Review of the U.S. Human Rights Record

Seeking to identify and expand bridges between UNA-USA members and the UN, UNA-USA is collaborating with chapters to conduct consultations for the Universal Periodic Review (UPR) of the U.S. human rights record in 2015. The UPR is a tool of the still relatively new UN Human Rights Council-established in 2006-which assesses the human rights record of all 193 UN members. The UPR offers a key window for grassroots activists and UN advocates to offer observations, ideas, and recommendations related to the human rights records of UN members. During the first review of the U.S. in 2011, for example, hundreds of civil society groups in the U.S. participated in the process. Ultimately, the U.S. even accepted many of the ideas during its inaugural review in Geneva, Switzerland where the Council is based. Now it is your turn.

In 2014, the UNA-USA chapters and division across the country will, for the first time ever, conduct consultation meetings on human rights topics ranging from the prevention of human trafficking to preventing violence and discrimination based on sexual orientation to advancing the rights of women and girls among others. The goal of the consultations is to develop concrete, actionable, constructive recommendations related to the U.S. UPR that will be synthesized into a report and sent directly to the UN Officer of the High Commissioner for Human Rights and U.S. State Department for review.

In May, the Southern New York State Division will hold a consultation focused on advancing the rights of women and girls, and on human trafficking. We may engage in other topics separately later. All, whether seasoned UN veterans or those who simply interested in the topic, are encouraged to participate and to share their perspectives. More details to come!

Brooklyn - UNA Brooklyn is springing ahead with plans for some diverse and compelling events. They are expected to include a program exploring education -- its significance and barriers -- for girls in post-conflict and refugee environments. Also on the drawing board is a panel with military, policy and legal experts who will discuss their views and experiences with UN peacekeeping through disarmament, demobilization and reintegration. In addition, members are preparing to advance UNA's advocacy mission via meetings with individual members of Brooklyn's congressional delegation. Meantime, the Chapter aims to have its revamped web site up and running in the weeks ahead, making it easier to keep up with these and other activities.

New York (Manhattan) - The Chapter will co-host an event at the Japan Society on March 27, on "JAPAN'S NEW NATIONAL SECURITY STRATEGY AND ITS IMPACTS ON REGIONAL STABILITY." On April 21, Ambassador Thomas Pickering will speak on "Iran-U.S. Relations: Challenges and Opportunities." The Chapter will hold its Annual Meeting on April 30 followed by a Book Talk with author Marwan Muasher on The Second Arab Awakening and the Battle for Pluralism.
