Universal Period Review Held on May 21, 2014

On Wednesday, May 21, the Division held a consultation to provide an American grassroots voice to the Universal Periodic Review of the U.S. record on Human Rights. The event took place at the UN Foundation Office in Manhattan. The consultation began with introductory remarks by Latanya Mapp Frett, Vice President - Global, Planned Parenthood Federation of America; Sarah Elizabeth Porter, Development Associate at ECPAT USA; and Ryan Kaminski, Leo Nevas Human Rights Fellow of UNA-USA. Jeanne Betsock Stillman, Division President, moderated the session.

Participants then divided into two groups: one, facilitated by Corinne Whitaker, reproductive health consultant, focused on advancing the rights of women and girls. The other, facilitated by Joan Levy, UNA-SNY Board member and board member of ECPAT USA, focused on human trafficking. Each group discussed its specific topic, arriving at recommendations and specifics to include in the final stakeholder's report that will go to the Human Rights Council.

After about an hour, the participants reconvened to share their findings. Joshua Cooper, Leon Nevas Human Rights Task Force member, coordinated those discussions and also provided his insights into the Human Rights Council UPR processes. The meeting was a great success with almost 30 participants working hard for the 2 ½ hours of the consultation to brainstorm on these two prominent issues. Corinne Walker (women and girls) and Maria Almario (human trafficking) are leading drafting of our reports.

Mid-Hudson Valley Chapter Forms!

We are happy to announce that the Mid-Hudson Valley organizing group has met all the requirements for a new Mid-Hudson Valley Chapter and held its first meeting with members from the area on May 19th. The meeting included 13 members, who adopted the chapter by-laws unanimously.

The slate of officers was also elected unanimously, establishing S. Ilgu Ozler as the President and advocacy chair, Stephen Pampinella as Vice President - Communications, Bruce Sillner as Treasurer, Sue Brooks as Secretary, Richard Kelder as Membership Chair and Stephen Miller as Program Chair. The United Nations Day event, which is to be held October 24th on the SUNY New Paltz campus, was then discussed. It will focus on human trafficking. Kathleen Durham, who was elected to the Programming Committee, will aid Stephen Miller with planning.

The Human Rights Day event will be held December 10th in the Wallace Center at the FDR Library. Its focus will be on prison reform, identified by our Division and the Chapter as an important human rights topic. The Chapter also spoke of the possibility of co-sponsoring an event with the World Affairs Council. Stephen Pampinella will attend the UNA-USA Annual Meeting in Washington, from June 8-10, with a visit to the Hill on the 10th.

The next chapter meeting will take place on September 8th or 9th at 5 pm, with notice going out to members and the community.

Both winners responded to one of three questions about a refugee situation: Taking a specific refugee group, discuss the steps that might be taken to solve their problems. Hong Tat Kong selected the Syrians and Tzuhsin Wang wrote about the Chinese.

Model UN Class of 2014 - Edison HS in Jamaica, Queens

The Thomas A Edison Vocational and Technical High School Model UN Class, many of whom are Gen UN members, decided to work on women's empowerment and education in Pakistan. The students decided to support a vocational school for women in Bhaun, Chakwal District, Pakistan where women learn tailoring and basic computer skills. Javed S. Admad, Treasurer of the Queens Chapter, had introduced the idea to the class last fall.

On May 30, the students held a fashion show at which they modeled outfits for women and men made by women at the school in Bhaun. The clothes are available for purchase and the proceeds will be donated to the school in Bhaun, now called the Human Enlightenment Centre.
